Dear friends in Christ,

October is here, which means another changing of the seasons. Farmers will continue to harvest their crops, and many of us will begin raking leaves and doing extra lawn work as we prepare for winter. I think October is one of my favorite months of the year. Football is back, the New York Yankees begin another playoff push to win the World Series (sorry Twins fans), the weather is just right, and as a good German you get to celebrate Oktoberfest. October also happens to be one of the favorite months of the year for children. Who as a little kid wasn't excited about Halloween? Who wasn't excited to be able to dress up in costumes, head around town, and enjoy the sugar rush from all the candy they received from neighbors and community members?

However, there is one other event that excites me about the month of October. As we head towards the end of October we as a church will celebrate a special day in the church year. No, it isn't Halloween. Rather, it is Reformation Sunday. As we gather for worship on October 31<sup>st</sup>, we will celebrate the reformation message, "the righteous shall live by faith" (Romans 1:17).

But what exactly does this message mean? To understand this we need to delve into our Lutheran history. Martin Luther grew up within a tradition where you were taught that you had to earn your salvation. You had to be righteous. You had to live a godly life otherwise God who is righteous would punish you for your sins. Luther later in his life would share these thoughts on Romans 1:17, "I hated that word, 'the righteousness of God,' by which I had been taught according to the custom and use of all teachers...that God is righteous and punishes the unrighteous sinner." Luther knew that he was to live a godly life, to strive to follow the example of Christ in word and deed. However, he could never escape the feeling that he was a sinner, that he had not done enough to atone for his sins. And because he had not done enough, he knew that God would punish him for his sins.

But as time went by Luther came to a new understanding of what the apostle Paul meant by "the righteous shall live by faith". While earning his doctorate and teaching as a professor at the University of Wittenberg he came to see this passage in a new light. Luther would write, "At last mediating day and night, by the mercy of God, I began to understand that the righteousness of God is that through which the righteous live by a gift of God, namely faith. Here I felt as if I were entirely born again and had entered paradise itself through the gates that had been flung open." Luther came to understand that this passage from Romans is not talking about how we must fill all the requirements of the law or God will punish us. Rather he came to understand that the righteous will live by faith, that is, they trust in the grace, mercy and forgiveness given to them in Christ's life, death, and resurrection.

Picture this way. In Matthew 20:1-16 Jesus tells a parable of a vineyard owner who hires workers early in the morning for the usual daily wage. The vineyard owner returned to the marketplace four more times during the day, at: 9 a.m., noon, 3 p.m., and 5 p.m. to hire more workers. He told those workers he would pay them the normal daily wage.

At the end of the day the vineyard owner pays the workers; starting with those who began work the latest. He gives them a full day's wage. The ones who began early in the day expected to receive more being they worked longer, but in the end they got the same, a full days wage. And so they begin to grumble about fairness, they endured the heat of the day and worked longer. But the vineyard owner tells them he is doing nothing wrong, they agreed for the usual daily wage. As for those who worked less and yet received the same, the vineyard owner asks, "Don't I have the right to do what I want with my own money? Or are you envious because I am generous?" (Matthew 20:16).

What we see in this parable is what Luther came to understand. It isn't about our works or what we do, or what we think we deserve. Rather it is all about the generosity of God. And this generosity is for all people. Simply put, it is all about grace. Those who worked for a shorter time did not get what they deserved. Rather, they received grace from the vineyard owner. They were given what they didn't deserve. In the same way, we who are sinners do not get what we deserve; we do not get eternal punishment for our sin. Rather we receive grace; we get what we do not deserve, namely forgiveness and a place in the family of God.

My friends, this is the good news we hear as we celebrate the reformation. We do not have to earn our salvation. We do not have wonder whether God loves us, or whether we have done enough to make God love us. Our sin, our failings, our shortcomings, will not separate us from the love of God. For as we turn towards our heavenly Father we find that Christ has made us righteous! The apostle Paul wrote, "The righteous shall live by faith." May we continue to live by that faith! May we continue to trust in those promises that God has made to us in our Savior and Lord Jesus Christ!
