IMMANUEL SPEAKS SEPTEMBER 2025



Dear Friends in Christ,

As we begin this new programming year together, I would like to share these words with you from the prophet Isaiah. In the 55th chapter of Isaiah God gives this invitation, "Ho, everyone who thirsts, come to the waters; and you that have no money, come, buy and eat! Come, buy wine and milk without money and without price. Why do you spend your money for that which is not bread, and your labor for that which does not satisfy? Listen carefully to me, and eat what is good, and delight yourselves in rich food. Incline your ear, and come to me; listen, so that you may live. I will make with you an everlasting covenant, my steadfast, sure love for David."

We have all heard it said, "Nothing in life is free, there has to be a catch, or there must be some strings attached." Sheldon cooper in the comedy *Big Bang Theory* would put it this way after being asked by his neighbor Penny to be a part of their secret Santa group, "Wait, you are going to buy me present? Why would you do such a thing? I know you think you're being generous, but the foundation of gift-giving is reciprocity. You haven't given me a gift, you've given me an obligation."

I think we all know what it is like to feel like Sheldon and Penny. Yes, there are times when we do or say something like Penny when she gave a Christmas gift to Sheldon. I think we can all recall a time when we were generous, when we simply said or did something because that is who we are. But there are also times we have said or did something expecting something in return. We identify with Sheldon who receives the gift and now feels obligated for different reasons to respond in kind. No matter how much we may try to avoid it, whether we are aware of it or not; we live in a transactional world where nothing is truly free.

However, my friends, this is not the way God's love works. God speaks these words of invitation from Isaiah 55 to a people who are in exile.

Time and time again God sent prophets to guide the people, but the people didn't listen. And because of the peoples' hard heartedness, God allowed foreign countries to conquer them and take them into exile.

Now if God operated how the world works, in a transactional way, then the people of Israel would have had three strikes pretty quickly. After all, 12 of the Old Testament books are attributed to prophets. This means by the time they end up in exile they would have swung and missed 12 times, if they were playing baseball. Now, we all know what happens when you have three strikes!!! You're out!!!

Now Imagine if the umpire told the batter, "I know it's strike three, but we're not leaving here until you hit a home run." We would think that umpire is out of his mind, that is not how the game works, that isn't how life works, nothing is free.

But notice the picture painted of God in these verses. God is not transactional but is pure boundless love. Even though the people of Israel messed things up time and time again, look at what God has to offer, and the best part is that there are no strings attached. God loved them for who they are. And the good news for us is that God loves us for who we are. He invites his people to come to him and receive the abundant and eternal life that he attends for all.

Beloved of God, it is truly an exciting time of the year as our fall programming kicks off and we experience the boundless love God has for us and the world. And so, whether you are in church every Sunday, whether it is been a while, or whether you have never stepped foot in a church before, the invitation is the same. It is for you, and you, and you, and even me. God extends his invitation to come and eat for free. God comes to fill you with love and grace!




